

ARCHIVAL ADVOCACY: ARGUING FOR THE VALUE OF ARCHIVES



 City Landscape in the 1960s / Everyday Life / Public Events & Services / Leisure Activities






Selection for 'Singapore in the 1960s'

- Reflection of Singapore's migrant population and linguistic diversity in the 1960s



- ~ 51, 358 video views in 3 months (Jun-Sep 2018)
- ~17,000 unique visitors
- Stories of Yesteryear viewers are:
 - Majority 35 to 44 years old
 - >57% born after 1970
 - >59% male




Dated Singapore 30th November 1863

Sir,

You will have seen by the Newspaper the alarming increase of deaths by tigers and I have now to report the death of two men within the last forty eight hours, will you have the goodness to solicit a sum of money, say fifty dollars to be placed at my disposal for the purchase of goats or calves, I would enclose the animal within a [paygar] previously rubbing under and over the neck with a preparation of strychnine I think this plan very likely to succeed at any rate some means ought to be tried to rid the Island of these animals. [\$50 reward for one tiger that men can for this.]



The President.

In taking into consideration the Extract of the letter from the Superintendent of the Botanic Garden at Calcutta, which has been transmitted to us by the Honorable the Governor General in Council in Mr. Secretary Lushington's Dispatch of the 23. January, I will not disguise that I have been prepared to afford a very favourable attention to Dr. Wallich's proposition for establishing a Botanic Garden or Nursery at this Island, and by the following reasons.

Several years ago the situation of this Island, midway between Bengal on the one hand, and China, Java and the Moluccas on the other, was deemed eminently advantageous for introducing the natural productions of the latter Countries into the Company's Territories and a Public



Sir,

I am directed by the Lieutenant Governor to transmit to you the enclosed notice in the Malay language under the signature of the Lieutenant Governor and the seals of the Sultan and [Toomoongoong?] with a Translation into the Chinese Language, relative to the Establishment of the local magistracy [here?] to take effect on the [13th?] Instant, and to request that you cause the same to be communicated without delay...delay to the principal native authorities and to be published by Beat of Gong, and afterwards affixed at the usual places for public information.


CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

- Added more pages to transcribe (now over 45,000 pages) to accommodate interest in transcribing
- Added new features based on user feedback tested beta versions with top contributors where applicable
 - Toggle layout feature for better transcription window
 - **Pie chart** added to understand the available items for each collection.
 - Indicator overlay to let the user know the status of each item
 - Option to filter items based on the status.
 - More reports added for ease of reporting and monitoring
